The Platform is a broad range of actions governments of the Americas can take to create healthy economies based on full employment and social and economic justice for all.

WHY DO WE NEED IT?


What has happened over the last 30 years is the opposite. Where there has been economic growth, it has been jobless growth. Millions of working men and women have been forced into unemployment, pushed into poverty, battered by bad working conditions and labour "flexibility". Farmers have been forced to abandon their land because they can no longer make a living. Social programs have been slashed. And all through the Americas — both within and between countries — the gap between rich and poor has grown.


WOMEN'S CONCERNS IN ALL POLICIES

Think of it as one of those airport scanners... Government officials Peer inside policy bags to look for things that are bad for sob creation.




INVESTMENT AND ECONOMIC PRIORITIES




Governments should focus on productive investments, and making sure foreign investors respect national laws.

Governments shouldn't just sit back and tinker with things like interest rates. Productive economies need hands-on government action in the right places. They should encourage investments that are productive, and prevent the ones that only suck money and resources out of our economies. And, they should provide good public services for all.

They should make sure foreign investors respect workers' rights and obey national laws. And that means obeying the decisions of the courts.





CANCEL THE WORST FOREIGN DEBT Many poorer countries have been crushed by foreign

debt for decades. They can't fight poverty, create good Jobs for everyone or develop sustainable economies while they are virtual slaves to foreign banks.

> Most of the foreign debt is illegitimate and unfair. Debts owed by the poorest countries to the richest ones should be cancelled now!

> > Banks and lending institutions must share in the responsibility for the bad debts they authorized.





SHARE THE WEALTH!!

The income and wealth gap is growing in all of the countries of the Americas, including the rich countries. Right across the hemisphere we see more billionaires and many more poor people. Not only is





Governments must help redistribute society's wealth more fairly by focussing on the needs of workers.

Full employment Make sure everyone has work.

Living wages ► Make sure every job pays enough to cover basic needs.

Universal unemployment insurance ▶ Make sure everyone who loses their job has some money to live on while they look for another job.

Public Services Provide universal health care, education, and other services so poor and working people can benefit too.

Reduction of the work week > Knock a couple of hours off the work week, and you've got enough work to go around for everyone!

Tax reform ▶ Make sure people and corporations are taxed fairly. The richer you are the more you pay, and the poorest shouldn't be taxed at all.




LET'S TAKE A CLOSER LOOK AT THIS LAST ONE, "TAX REFORM"

TAX AND SPEND ... IT'S NOT A CRIME



Governments must follow good "fiscal policies".

That's where governments use their powers to collect taxes and spend the money on things that help the economy. Taxes should be "progressive". Progressive taxation means the more you earn, the more you pay. Wealthier people can afford it. By using the tax money to pay for things that benefit society at large, governments help spread society's wealth around, and that creates a healthy, productive economy.



SO STRONG LOCAL DEVELOPMENT EQUALS INDEPENDENCE FROM GLOBALIZATION. COOL!





Governments should provide support and protection for networks of small, local producers and distributors.

Governments can help build links among local producers and distributors who provide the goods and services local people need to survive. When local regions become more self-sufficient, they become less vulnerable to damage from the international profit-making machine of alobalization.



SUPPORT FOR FAMILY FARMING

The people who know how to produce our food are disappearing! All over the Americas, family farming is in decline. Small farmers have been pushed off their land by the practices of giant transnational agribusiness corporations, by falling world commodity prices, and by free trade which favours large

corporations. As more and more farmers aive up. communities all over the hemisphere are becoming less able to meet their own food needs, and more dependent on food imports and big corporations.



Each country must support its small, independent farmers, and they should do it as part of a larger plan for becoming self-sufficient in food.

WAIT!! DON'T GO!! WHAT DO YOU NEED? CASH? LAND? LEGISLATED PROTECTION AGAINST THE VAGARIES OF INTERNATIONAL COMMODITY MARKETS?



PRIVATIZATIONS: HAVE THEY REALLY BEEN WORTH IT?

In recent years governments have privatized everything from phone companies. to city water systems. to hospitals. Sure. privatization has meant big profits for the companies involved. But most citizens have not benefited. Often, the service is poorer while user fees make it too expensive. Poor people end up having less access to vital services.





HEMISPHERIC FUNDS



Rich countries and regions have a duty to help the poorest ones, and they can do so through special hemispheric funds.

We need to set up international funds to help regions that are struggling to develop. Some funds can be organized to cover the whole hemisphere, while others can be organized within sub-regions. Funds can be used to help poorer areas build infrastructure, eliminate hunger, provide Job training and good public health care, and combat pandemics such as HIV AIDS— Just to name a few.

As we have seen, the Platform calls on governments to work in all kinds of ways toward the creation of jobs, so everyone can have work. But, a job without adequate pay or safe working conditions does not make DECENT work.



Governments must strictly enforce their national labour laws. And, they should work to IMPROVE the laws so workers have all the protections they need.



EXCUSE ME SIR,

UNIVERSAL SOCIAL SAFETY NETS

Social security is a human right — that means protection from economic losses due to health problems, old age, or lack of work. Yet millions of people across the Americas are not protected. This is a crisis in our economies. Some programs have been cut, others privatized, while others never existed at all.



It's government's responsibility to guarantee social and economic protection for all citizens.



UNIONS AND COLLECTIVE BARGAINING

Strong unions promote workers rights — and lead to a healthy democracy.





Governments must work with labour organizations to come up with ways to strengthen the collective bargaining process.

END DISCRIMINATION!

WHY CAN'T I APPLY FOR THE JOB? LOOK, I'M QUALIFIED!



No one should face discrimination in the workplace — or when they're trying to find work. Shutting people out based on gender, race, sexual orientation, culture or nationality is wrong.

THE PLATFORM SAYS...

We need strong antidiscrimination policies, and these should be enforced by special sub-regional boards.

FREEDOM TO MIGRATE — OR NOT!





All people should be guaranteed the right NOT to have to migrate. But for those who have migrated, they need to have their human rights protected.





MAKING THE PLATFORM A REALITY

Over the comina years, labour organizations will be working with each other and with citizens' aroups. regionally and subregionally, on ways to implement the Platform's goals. Groups across the hemisphere will keep track of things like inequality, poverty. unemployment, informal employment, gender equality, child labour, and the Gender Development Index (UNDP).


Participants will meet in yearly forums to discuss how the implementation is going, and what more needs to be done.
